EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 32

Series of 2020

"AN ORDER DECLARING THE ENTIRE CITY OF BISLIG UNDER MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE (MGCQ) AND PRESCRIBING IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS THEREOF"

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization declared a pandemic on the spread of Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19);

WHEREAS, President Rodrigo R. Duterte issued Presidential Proclamation No. 922 placing the country in a State of Public Health Emergency and Presidential Proclamation No. 929 declaring a State of Calamity in the entire country for a period of six (6) months;

WHEREAS, the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) has issued an Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, Mayor Florencio C. Garay issued Executive Order No. 30 that took effect last May 1, 2020 placing the entire City of Bislig under General Community Quarantine;

WHEREAS, the IATF-EID issued a resolution which provides that low-risk areas should be placed under Modified General Community Quarantine from June 1-15, 2020;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160 also known as the Local Government Code provides that within their respective territorial jurisdiction, local government units shall ensure and promote health and safety of their inhabitants;

NOW, THEREFORE, I FLORENCIO C. GARAY, City Mayor of Bislig City, Surigao del Sur, by virtue of the power vested in me by law, do hereby order the following during the duration of the Modified General Community Quarantine, to wit:

SECTION I. Modified General Community Quarantine Guidelines. The following shall be observed during the effectivity of this order, to wit:

1. Minimum public health standards shall be complied with at all times for the duration of the MGCQ.
2. All individuals are obliged to observe **social distancing** of at least one (1) meter from each other.
3. Wearing of **face mask is mandatory** when going out in public.
4. All persons shall now be allowed outside their residence but are encouraged to stay at home for their own safety. No travel pass will be required when going in and out of the city.
5. Barangay and Purok officials shall strictly enforce to their respective constituents the strict observance of social distancing and wearing of face mask in all public places.
6. City-wide **liquor ban** shall be in effect from 9PM to 4AM.

7. **Curfew starts from 9PM to 4AM** in consonance with Provincial Ordinance No. 32-20 enacted on March 31, 2020.
8. Indoor and outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of exercise such as but not limited to walking, jogging, running, biking, golf, swimming, tennis, badminton, equestrian, and skateboarding are allowed. *Provided*, that the **minimum public health standards such as wearing of masks and the maintenance of social distancing protocols**, and no sharing of equipment where applicable, are observed.
9. Mass gatherings such as but not limited to, movie screenings, concerts, sporting events and other entertainment activities, community assemblies, and non-essential work gatherings shall be allowed provided that participants shall be **limited to fifty percent (50%)** of the venue or seating capacity.
10. Religious gatherings shall be allowed up to fifty percent (50%) of the church, chapel or venue seating capacity.
11. Face-to-face or in-person classes may be conducted in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) provided there is strict compliance with minimum public health standards, consultation with local government units, and compliance with guidelines set by CHED. HEI activities that involve gathering of students shall continue to be prohibited.

For K-12 Basic Education, the Basic Education Learning Continuity Plan of the DepEd shall be adopted.

12. Work in all public and private offices may be allowed to resume physical reporting to work at full operating capacity, with alternative arrangements for persons who are sixty (60) years old and above, those with immunodeficiency, comorbidity, or other health risks, and pregnant women.
13. Work in government offices may be at full operational capacity, or under such alternative work arrangements as agencies may deem appropriate in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations issued by the Civil Service Commission (CSC). Accredited diplomatic missions and international organizations may resume full operations.
14. Public transportation shall be allowed to operate at the capacity in accordance with guidelines issued by the Bislig City Tricycle Franchising Regulatory and Traffic Management Board (BCTFRITMB), LTRFB and DOTr. *Provided*, a **strict one (1) meter distance between passengers** shall be observed.
15. Private transportation shall be allowed subject to the guidelines provided by DOTr.
16. Still **no back ride policy** for motorcycle.
17. All public and private construction projects shall be allowed, but with strict compliance to the issued construction safety guidelines for the implementation of infrastructure projects during the COVID-19 pandemic by the DPWH.
18. Offices, establishments or individuals conducting or providing activities or services **are allowed to operate or work under the following conditions:**

Category 1

Agriculture, fishery, and forestry industries, food manufacturing and food supply chain businesses, including food retail establishments such as supermarkets, grocery stores, and food preparation establishments and delivery services, food delivery services, health-related establishments, the logistics sector, information technology and telecommunication companies, the media, **at full operational capacity.**

Category 2

Mining and other manufacturing, export-oriented, and electronic commerce companies, as well as other delivery, repair and maintenance, and housing and office services, **at full operational capacity.**

Category 3

Financial services, BPOs, legal and accounting, and auditing services, professional, scientific, technical, and other non-leisure services, and other non-leisure wholesale and retail establishments, **at full operational capacity**, and without prejudice to work-from-home and other alternative work arrangements.

- Nevertheless, barber shops, salons, and other personal care service establishments shall be allowed to operate **at a maximum of fifty percent (50%) only.**
- Dine-in services of all food establishments shall be limited **at a maximum of fifty percent (50%) of its seating capacity.**

Category 4

Amusement, gaming, and fitness establishments, as well as those in the kids and the tourism industries, **at a maximum of fifty percent (50%) operational capacity.**

SECTION 2. Interzonal and Intrazonal Movement.

2.1. Definition.

2.1.1. Interzonal movement – the movement of people, goods and services across areas under different community quarantine classifications.

2.1.2. Intrazonal movement – the movement of the people, goods and services between localities under the same community quarantine classification, without transmitting through an area placed under a different classification.

2.2. Guidelines.

2.2.1. All persons entering Bislig City must be checked for signs and symptoms in the established checkpoints and subject to questioning for travel history. Every checkpoint must strictly implement mandatory temperature check and proper disinfecting procedures.

2.2.2. All persons entering and exiting the Province of Surigao del Sur shall be required to obtain a travel pass in accordance with Section 3 of Executive Order No. 20 of Governor Alexander T. Pimentel.

2.2.3. The movement of all types of cargoes by land, air, or sea within and across areas placed under any form of community quarantine shall be unhampered. Workers in the logistics sector, such as cargo, trucking, courier delivery and port operations shall likewise be allowed to transit across areas placed under any form of community quarantine. Provided, that only a maximum of five (5) personnel may operate cargo and delivery vehicles by land, with or without load.

2.2.4. The movement as such of the following persons within and across areas placed under any form of community quarantine shall be permitted: (1) health and emergency frontline services personnel, (2) government officials and government frontline personnel, (3) duly-authorized humanitarian assistance actors (HAAs), (4) persons travelling for medical or humanitarian reasons, (5) persons going to the airport for travel abroad, (6) returning or repatriated OFWs and other Overseas Filipinos (OFs) returning to their place of residence, (7) other persons transported through the efforts of the national government upon observance of the necessary quarantine protocols and with the concurrence of the receiving LGUs, and (8) anyone crossing zones for work permitted in the zone of destination, and going back home.

2.2.5. Authorized shuttle services shall be allowed to travel within and across areas placed under any form of community quarantine, with priority given to persons rendering health and emergency frontline services.

2.2.6. Land air or sea travel by uniformed personnel, government officials and employees for official business with the corresponding travel authority, and HAAs, especially those transporting medical supplies and laboratory specimens related to COVID-19, and other relief and humanitarian assistance, shall be allowed.

Travel authority/pass is only required for stranded individuals and returning overseas Filipinos as clarified by the DILG.

2.2.7. OFWs, students enrolled abroad and participants accepted in exchange visitor programs, permanent residents of foreign jurisdictions, and stranded foreign nationals, or those leaving for medical and other humanitarian reasons may leave for abroad through any of the airports or seaports in the country. *Provided*, that departing passengers may be accompanied by not more than one (1) person when travelling to any international port, who shall be allowed to return to his/her point of origin.

2.2.8. Repatriated OFWs or returning non-OFWs who have been issued a DOH or LGU certificate of completion of fourteen (14)-day facility-based quarantine, those who may be required to undergo a mandatory fourteen (14)-day home quarantine, or those who are issued with travel authority upon testing negative for COVID-19, shall be granted unhampered transit across zones en route to their final destination. No other requirement shall be imposed in this regard.

2.2.9. The interzonal movement of persons between areas placed under GCQ and MGCQ for any purpose other than leisure shall be permitted.

2.2.10. Movement to and from an area placed under GCQ to an area where no community quarantine is in place shall be permitted, except for the sole purpose of leisure. The movement of persons for any purpose across areas placed under MGCQ and areas where no community quarantine is in place shall be permitted.

SECTION 3. Quarantine Guidelines. To ease congestion in our quarantine facilities, the following guidelines shall be followed:

1. Returning Residents/LSI from areas **with** Covid-19 community transmission shall be quarantined in a facility identified by the LGU.
2. Returning Residents/LSI from area **without** Covid-19 community transmission shall be quarantined at home, to be monitored by BHERTs twice a day (AM & PM).
3. Patients admitted and discharged in hospitals located in areas with local community transmission (Davao, Tagum and Cagayan) and was picked up by the LGU must be quarantined at home and to be monitored by BHERTs twice a day (AM & PM).
4. Patients admitted and discharged in hospitals and stayed **for more than 24 hours** in areas with local community transmission (Davao, Tagum, Cagayan, Cebu and NCR) must be quarantined in a facility identified by the LGU.
5. Exempted in the quarantine facility identified by the LGU are the following and should be quarantined at home and to be monitored by BHERTs twice a day regardless of whether they are from Covid/Non Covid Places, to wit:
 - a) Cancer patient undergoing radio chemotherapy
 - b) AIDS patient
 - c) End stage Renal Disease patient
 - d) Terminally ill patient secondary to PTB and Autoimmune Disease

- e) Post stroke patient, post heart attack patient
- f) Pregnant and Post-partum mother
- g) Transplant patient taking immunosuppressive drugs
- h) Severely malnourished patient
- i) Children 18 years old and below

SECTION 4. Penal Clause. Any person found to have unlawfully resisted or disobeyed the order/s of a Person in Authority or his Agents shall be penalized in accordance with the provisions of Article 151 of the Revised Penal Code and other pertinent laws.

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. In the event that any provision in this Order or any part hereof is declared invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the provisions not affected thereby shall remain in force and in effect.

SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. All orders, rules and regulations, other issuances, or parts hereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 7. Effectivity. This Executive Order shall take effect at 12:01AM of 3 JUN 2020 and shall remain in force unless sooner revoked or amended.
